...from the Farmer

It may be winter, but spring is only two months away and there are plenty of things to be doing and thinking about in July. Here's a few ideas from Adrian for your productive garden:

Planning:

How much space do you have to grow your food in? What would you like to be harvesting in spring? Where will you be sourcing your seeds or plants from?

Garden prep:

Keep turning your compost.

Improve your soil in readiness for sowing.

Keep on top of the weeds.

Propagating:

They may be slow, but you can still plant some cool season crops like lettuce, asian greens and garlic. Try a green manure crop.

Pruning deciduous fruit trees:

If you've got young trees, winter pruning will increase their vigour. If you've got older trees, wait until late summer to prune them.
